Kathryn has served the City since 1990 when she was appointed Assistant City Clerk-Treasurer. In September 1995 she was appointed the City's sixth and longest serving City Clerk-Treasurer. In preparation for her retirement in late 2017, treasury, tax collection, animal control services, and other finance related programs were reassigned to a new Administrative Services Department as of July 1st.

Kathryn is Whittier's election official, legislative officer, and Political Reform Act filing officer. She assists all departments with Brown Act (Open Meeting Act) compliance, and is responsible for preservation of City and associated agencies' official records and making those records available to the public. Her department provides 24/7 network and telephone services to all City departments and is responsible for the City website, fleet of PC and printers as well as specialty technology equipment. Current department projects include online permitting and payments, updating the City website, and implementation of an electronic document management system (EDMS) in preparation for increased on-line access to public records.

Prior to working for Whittier, Kathryn worked for the cities of Pasadena, Lakewood, Bellflower and Fountain Valley providing city clerk, personnel and/or community development program services since 1978.

Kathryn holds a BS degree in applied management from Azusa Pacific University. She is a member of the City Clerks Association of California and the International Institute of Municipal Clerks (IIMC) and was the first of IIMC's more than 10,000 members to attain the Master Municipal Clerk designation evidencing a commitment to professional education.
